

Ellen Aders, 219 E. Prospect Street, echoed Mrs. Schmitt’s comments. She voiced concern about the miscommunication between the Town, Discover Front Royal and the County. She reminded Council of the allocation of funding to be spent on Phase II of the Visitor Center that will be lost if not used by the end of the calendar year. She urged that a decision be made to move forward.

Scott Lloyd, 1049 Happy Creek Road, gave Council a brief justification for the nine chickens he had currently on his property that was against Town Code regulations. He asked that Council revisit the ordinance to increase the number of chickens allowed in Town limits.

REPORTS

A. Town Manager Report – Mr. Waltz gave the following presentation.



Mayor Cockrell questioned the number of those who used automatic payment method. Director of Finance advised that it was less than 1%. Councilman Rappaport questioned how visitors were calculated. Mr. Waltz advised that it was calculated manually. Council commented on how the meals and lodging tax was close to budget.

B. Town Council Reports –

Councilwoman DeDomenico-Payne wished everyone a safe Memorial Day Weekend and to remember those who served.

Councilman Rogers thanked the members of Discover Front Royal for their comments tonight. He recognized their hard work and looked forward to working through the issues. He thanked Niki Foster, Executive Director of the Chamber of Commerce and everyone who volunteered and participated in the Wine/Craft Festival to make it a huge success. He voiced his concern that “open discussion” had been removed from the work session agendas indefinitely and requested that the Mayor place it back on the agenda. He explained that it was an opportunity to speak about issues that were on Council’s minds.

Vice Mayor Sealock thanked the members of Discover Front Royal for their comments tonight. He commented on the “good show” of volunteers at the Wine/Craft Festival and the Police Department for their presence during the festival.

Councilwoman Morris thanked the members of Discover of Front Royal for their comments tonight. She thanked Mr. Lloyd for his concerns pertaining to the number of chickens allowed in Town and asked to be added to an upcoming work session. She commented on the success of the Family Fun Day Parade and the Wine/Craft Festival, the beauty of the red/white/blue flowers planted and the Adopt-A-Street Program. She noted that it was at the Mayor’s discretion to continue “open discussion” on future work session

agendas. She gave an update on the Transportation Subcommittee meeting stating that issues are being addressed with Norfolk/Southern Railroad, Virginia Department of Transportation, Town Council, County Board of Supervisors and developers/contractors all being in the same room for discussion.

Councilman Ingram reiterated what Councilwoman Morris stated regarding the subcommittee. He advised that he attended a Commonwealth Transportation Meeting recently and talked to several people about the Smart Scale Program for Happy Creek Road Phase II. He also mentioned the funding for the Shenandoah Rail Trail.

Councilman Rappaport thanked the members of the Discover Front Royal for their comments and expressed hope that there will be a conclusion. He stated that he believed in one Economic Development Authority.

C. Mayor Report – Mayor Cockrell listed the events that she attended and thanked those involved in making them a success: Nacho Party on Main Street hosted by Downtown Front Royal; Family Fun Day hosted by Willie/Nina Huck; Wine/Craft Festival hosted by the Chamber of Commerce. She advised that none of the events could be “pulled off” without the assistance of volunteers and Town staff, commenting on the amount of planning and work involved. She reminded the public that there were two openings on the Front Royal Economic Development Authority (FREDA) and a Special Election for two seats on Town Council in November, with a deadline to get on ballot of August 18th.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

A. FY23 Budget Amendment and Budget Transfer for Additional Revenue for Projects

Council approved a FY23 Budget Amendment in the amount of \$480,000 to account for revenues that exceeded FY23 budgeted amounts and to approve a FY23 Budget Transfer in the amount of \$248,000 from the General Fund to Street Fund to allocate additional funds for the Town to move forward with a Transportation Plan, Criser Road Sidewalk Project, and Paving Projects.

B. Bid for Remanufactured 500KVA Three-Phased Pad-Mounted Transformer for Fleet Maintenance Bldg

Council approved a bid for a remanufactured 500 kVA Three-Phase Pad-Mounted Transformer, for the Fleet Maintenance Department in the amount of \$25,625.00 from Jerry's Electric, Inc.

C. Bid for Breakers and Voltage Regulators for Happy Creek Substation Expansion Project

council approved a bid for (2) 15.5 KV, 1200A Outdoor Circuit Breakers to Meyers Controlled Power in the amount of \$60,336.00 and (6) 7.62 KV, 250KVA, 328A Single Phase Voltage Regulators to Howard Industries in the amount of \$206,730.00 for the Happy Creek Substation Expansion Project.

D. Bid for Dump Body, Hoist and Hydraulic System for Public Works Dump Truck

Council approved a bid for the purchase of a dump body, hoist and hydraulic system for the Public Works dump truck from Godwin Manufacturers in the amount of \$54,832.60.

E. FY2022-2023 Write Off for Bad Debt

Council approved the removal of 5 years or older of outstanding accounts receivable (bad debts) totaling \$47,314.36 (151 utility accounts) from the Town's ledger for the remainder of fiscal year 2022-2023.

Councilman Ingram moved seconded by Councilwoman Morris that Council approve the Consent Agenda as presented.
